The Corn Islands of Nicaragua have a history that goes several centuries back. In the early days Big Corn Island was a paradise for pirates. Although several famous explorers passed the island around the year 1500 it would take more than 160 years before a foreign pirate reached out to connect with the local tribe, also known as the Kukra's – Mayangna Indians.

Although the tourism is growing, when compared with the more popular and well known islands of the Caribbean such as Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Vincent or San Andrés the Big Corn Island is relatively unknown and hidden in the ocean. The island lies 70 kilometers out of the shore of Nicaragua and one can reach it by ferry or airplane. The total surface is only 9 square kilometers, nevertheless there are many Hotels & Resorts and even a hospital.

The Island offers a wide range of beaches where one can relax and enjoy the sun or discover the magic underwater world by Scuba Diving, which is one of the main tourist highlights of Big Corn Island. The large variety of coral species and the many kinds of tropical fish turns the waters around Big Corn into a Scuba Diving paradise.
